Serving as Principal Conductor of the Berlin Symphony Orchestra, resident in the prestigious Philharmonie Berlin, with a distinguished career spanning 30 years as a professional violinist and conductor, Dodds is not only a consummate conductor but also a passionate advocate for contemporary music. In 2021, he founded the ZeMu! Ensemble, premiering multimedia works like "The Once and Future" at the Singapore International Arts Festival. # A NOTE FROM STAN.



It gives me great pleasure to commence my role as Chief Conductor of The.SYO with such a varied and personal program. It embodies much of who I am as a musician - open to all forms of music, refusing to be pigeon-holed.

Time and space refract through a kaleidoscope of works today, encompassing German Romantic masterpieces alongside works by living composers.

I call upon my background of 30 years as a violinist in the Berlin Philharmonic with excerpts from two of the most seminal works of German Opera Literature. Wagner's "Tristan und Isolde" and Strauss' "Der Rosenkavalier" are both passionate love stories and reflections on the passing of time, set to some of the most exquisite music ever written. "Tristan und Isolde" also nods to The.SYO's next concert where we will perform Olivier Messiaen's "Turangalīla-Symphonie", composed as part of his "Tristan Trilogy".

Brett Dean's short and powerful tone poem describes the events at the end of the life of Vladimir Komarov's, the first human casualty of the highly politicised 1960s space race. Brett has been a significant influence in my artistic development, as a colleague in the Berlin Philharmonic, and provider of my first conducting opportunity at the 2001 National Music Camp, subsequently encouraging me to pursue conducting seriously.

I have worked with Cathy Milliken for many years at the Berlin Philharmonic, engaging in numerous projects she conceived. Together we ran a composition competition for school students, selecting works from Germany and beyond, workshopping and performing them at the Philharmonie in Berlin. Cathy writes, "'Sky' is a beautiful word. It suggests endlessness. One can sound it on a long breath too." I can remember my first visit back to Australia after a long Covid absence, and how I was struck by how huge the sky is down under.

I am thrilled to present Gabriela Ortiz's "Téenek - Invenciones de Territorio" for the first time in Australia. Herself, a product of Mexican folk musicians and leading conservatories in Europe, Ortiz represents a bridge between ancient and contemporary western cultures, resulting in infectious, uplifting and energy driven music. The word "Téenek" translates as "local man", and her music invokes the connection between man and the territory he inhabits.

I wish to thank our sponsors and donors for their continued support, and all the dedicated parents who play a crucial role in giving their children the gift of music for life.

#### Gabriela ORTIZ

### Téenek (Invenciones de Territorio) 2017

Consisting of multiple inventions, each unique in their expression and musical development; Téenek (Invenciones de Territorio) is a metaphor for the possibility of a world without borders, where cultural identities are celebrated for their distinct uniqueness and differences.

Téenek is the language spoken in the Huasteca region of Mexico and translates to "local man." The work was commissioned by the LA Philharmonic in 2017 and was premiered at the Walt Disney Concert Hall by Gustavo Dudamel.

One of the leading composers in Mexico today, Ortiz is Grammy-nominated, having written for dance, theatre and cinema, in addition to collaborations with poets, playwrights and historians. With parents who were founding members of the band Los Folkloristas, the influence of traditional Mexican music can be heard in many of her compositions. Her works often closely reference the intersections between gender issues, social justice and environmental concerns, in addition to an increasingly multicultural and globalised world.

An oboist herself, Milliken features prominent oboe melodies appearing throughout the work, eventually joined by the trumpet. Listen out for reference to the Ukranian song known as "Carol of the Bells", by Ukranian composer Mykola Dmytrovych Leontovych.

Born in Brisbane and based in Berlin, Milliken is an internationally renowned composer, performer, and founding member of Ensemble Modern. She has written for concert, opera, radio and film, and has been recipient of several awards including the Prix Italia and APRA AMCOS/AMC Art Music Award. "Catalogue of Sky" was commissioned by the Sydney Symphony Orchestra in 2022, as part of their 50 Fanfares Project.

# Tristan und Isolde, WWV 90: Prelude & Liebestod 1857-1859

A passionate love story and reflection on the passing of time, the Prelude & Liebestod is often performed as a standalone excerpt, combining the opening scene (Prelude) with Isolde's final scene (Liebestod- translating to "Love-death").



Tristan und Isolde tells the popular tale of an illicit love affair. Doomed by societal constraints and a fateful love potion, Tristan and Isolde's story culminates in their tragic deaths, as they embrace love's transcendence beyond earthly bounds.

A muse to generations of composers, Wagner was born in Leipzig, Germany, 1813 and died in Venice, Italy, 1883. He is most celebrated for a lifelong contribution to Opera, with major works including The Flying Dutchman, Tannhäuser and Tristan und Isolde. Throughout the development of his operatic output, Wagner strived for an ideal known as the Gesamtkunstwerk or "total artwork", where multiple forms of art (such as dance, music or literature) synthesise to create one complete work.

### **Brett DEAN**

### Komarov's Fall 2006

Written in memory of Soviet Cosmonaut Vladimir Mikhailovich Komarov (1927-1967) who tragically died during the re-entry of his Soyuz I spacecraft. The craft was not deemed ready for flight by engineers yet flew due to political pressures during the "space race" of the 1960s.

Komarov's Fall was commissioned as part of the Berlin Philharmonic's Ad Astra Project, premiered by Sir Simon Rattle in 2006. The work features an urgent semiquaver rhythm, first heard in the woodblocks, inspired by an archival recording of Komarov's discussions with the control centre from aboard his craft. A brief lyrical section in the middle of the piece pays homage to Komarov's final farewell to his wife, Valentina, who was able to speak with her husband from the control centre.

Brett Dean is an internationally renowned Australian composer, violist and conductor. He began his studies in Brisbane before moving to Germany in 1984 where he was a member of the Berlin Philharmonic for 14 years. Dean is currently Composer in Residence with the London Philharmonic Orchestra and Orchestre National de Lyon, and Artist in Residence with the Swedish Chamber Orchestra.

### **Richard STRAUSS**

# Der Rosenkavalier, TrV 227d, op.59: Suite [1945] 1909-1910

Set in 18th century Vienna, Der Rosenkavalier tells the story of a bittersweet love triangle involving the Marschallin, her young lover Octavian, and the ingenue Sophie.

The Suite begins following the events of the opera with a brilliant opening passage from the horns and strings. Melodies in the flutes, violins, harp and celesta depict Octavian's gifting of the silver rose from Baron Ochs to Sophie. Following the famous trio and duet, a Waltz from the opera brings the Suite to a close.

Born in Munich in 1864, Richard Strauss (1864-1949) is particularly well known for his tone poems, a genre characterised by its vivid portrayal of an extra-musical idea, including death and transfiguration. With an output including almost 200 songs and several operas (including Salome and Elektra), Strauss was also a conductor, who held the position of Principal Conductor of the Weimar Court Orchestra in 1889.

# The.SYO (The Sydney Youth Orchestra)

Established in 1973 by legendary conductor and educator Peter Seymour, The.SYO has become an important steppingstone for hundreds of young musicians into professional careers in the music and arts sector. The.SYO is powered by SYO.
